CYBER SCHOOL CONTESTS GUIDELINES, MECHANICS AND SCHEDULES

This Division

1. Pursuant to Division Memorandum No. 221, s.2021, Curricular and Co-curricular

Activities will be conducted right after the lesson proper in the Cyber School through DepEd Tayo Tangub.

2. Here are the Guidelines, Mechanics and Schedules of the different contests:

A. THE WIZZARDS' QUEST (A Division Math Competition)

Tangub City Division's Cyber School via Facebook Live is holding a 60 minute period "The Wizards' Quest" every Monday of the week at 4:00-5:00 in the afternoon for the Secondary Level and every Tuesday of a week at 11:00-12:00 in the morning for the Elementary Level.

This Wizard's Quest aims to:

- awaken greater interest in Mathematics among school learners;
- encourage them to strive for excellence in Mathematics
- develop the values of hard work, perseverance, honesty and sportsmanship
- develop learners to become problem solvers and critical thinkers

General Guidelines and Mechanics

- The wizards' quest is open to all Grade 5 to Grade 10 learners presently enrolled in public elementary schools this school year 2021 – 2022, this division.
- The contest shall be conducted by schools in the district to ensure 100% schools' participation and it does not limit to 1 section only. Additional number of participants to schools with more sections. Learners to compete are not identified as participants to other contests both academic and non – academic to encourage mass participation among learners.
- The contestants can use any of the following technology;





- 3.1 Laptop or Computer desktop
- 3.2 Tablet or Cellphones

4. The contestants shall be provided with a link through their District in Charge and shall register their name a day before the date contest proper.
5. The contestants are required to wear their school uniform and School ID if available. If none, any school dress comfortable is accepted.
6. The Wizards' Quest shall be a written oral competition. This entails reading of questions orally by the Quizmaster and contestants will write down their answers in the tag board/illustration board prepared by the school.
7. Each contestant shall be provided with a tag board, chalk and eraser to write down their answer. A day before the competition, the name of the school and student must be written on the upper left part of the tag board for identification.
8. All contestants are required to Turn ON their video at all times. However, you are also required to mute yourself so you don't distract the other contestants
9. There shall be no other person around the contestants during the contest proper.
10. There shall be twenty (20) questions consisting of: Ten (10) fifteen-second questions worth 2 points each for the FIRST ROUND; Five (5) thirty-second questions worth 3 points each for the SECOND ROUND and; Five (5) one-minute questions worth 5 points each for the THIRD ROUND, for a total of sixty (60) points. The timing in each round begins when the Quizmaster gives the go-signal after the second reading of the question.
 - 10.1 The 15-second questions are to be solved mentally. There will be no writing of solutions anywhere, neither on the palms, answer sheet, etc.
 - 10.2 For the 30-second questions, contestants shall be provided with clean scratch papers by the school where they can write their solutions. They may begin solving as soon as the Quizmaster begins reading the question.
 - 10.3 For the 1-minute questions, contestants shall be provided with clean scratch papers by the school where they can write their solutions. The question will be flashed on the screen when the Quizmaster starts reading the question.
11. There will be 2 judges assigned in each district schools to record their score in the tally board for all contestants and shall identify the Top 1 winner in the district to qualify for the division round competition.
12. Division round in the Reading Challenge shall be conducted after all district schools identify their winners following the same guidelines and mechanics.





13. The participants, District In - Charges, school heads, coaches, quizmaster, timer and recorder are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect, honesty, and good sportsmanship toward each other during the wizards' quest competition.

14. Certificate of Participation will be given to all participants and coaches. District and division winners shall receive Certificate of Recognition and Appreciation.

B. YOUNG WRITERS OLYMPICS

1. This contest is named 'Young Writers Olympics' - a Modified RBI Online Journalistic Writing Contest in English and Filipino of Tangub City Division's Cyber School via Facebook Live

2. The competition is open to all Grade 5-10 learners in the Division of Tangub City

3. There will be a school level contest first to pick out the best to represent in the District; a maximum of two contestants for English and another two for Filipino

4. In the District level, three winners shall be announced and shall receive Certificate of Recognition but only the first-place winners of the ten Districts shall proceed to the Division level semi-final round

5. In the semi-final round, top five winners shall be chosen to advance to the Division finals.

6. For the Division finals, the top five young writers will vie for championship, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th places. The top five winning writers and advisers shall be accorded with certificates and medals from the management.

7. The contest will be conducted every Tuesday at 4:00-5:00 in the afternoon for high school while every Wednesday at 11:00 in the morning to 12:00 noon for elementary;

8. The ongoing conduct of the contest can be viewed at DepEd Tangub Tayo FB live and at Astral Academy Facebook Page;

9. This writing activity is a one-hour contest that comprises the following:

- 15 minutes- Preliminaries and Reading of the Mechanics and Criteria,
- 40 minutes- Writing Contest Proper, and
- 05 minutes- Uploading of the Contest Output, a total of 60 minutes.

10. The District In charge shall endorse the name of the contestant, school and adviser to the contest coordinator thru messenger a day before the contest schedule

11. The writing contest shall be done virtually, therefore, contestants are required to prepare electronic gadgets (laptop, android mobile phone, PC and the like





12. District In-charge, school heads and teacher-coaches shall ensure and take into consideration the quality internet connection in the venue of the qualified participants while, at the same time, must be observing proper health protocols

13. District In charge or a school head will be assigned as facilitator to ensure thorough conduct of the contest

14. The writing contest shall focus on basic news writing, feature writing, editorial, column writing, caption writing, sports writing and cartooning,

15. The Division contest coordinator shall provide the contest piece of the day including the instructions;

16. The output shall be uploaded to the link which will be provided on the contest day right after the 60-minute writing contest; and

7. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and unappealing.

C. Spell Check

Tangub City Division's Cyber Classroom via Facebook Live is holding a 30 minute period 'Spell Check' program every Monday of a week at 11:00 – 11:30 in the morning.

General Guidelines and Mechanics

1. The written spelling competition is open to all Grade – 3 and Grade 4 learners presently enrolled in public elementary schools this school year 2021 – 2022, this division. Filipino language for Grade – 3 and English for Grade – 4, and for the 1st round to compete are the Grade – 3 learners effectively

2. The contest shall be conducted by schools in the district to ensure 100% schools' participation and it does not limit to 1 section only. Additional number of participants to schools with more sections. District schools then will get the top 3 winners to compete during the championship round in the division level.

3. It is the responsibility of the School Heads to preregister their contestants and coaches to the District In – Charge and the later shall submit the final names of spellers to the Division's Spell Check Team 2 days before the date contest proper.

4. The contestants are required to wear their school uniform and School ID if available. If none, any school dress comfortable is accepted.

5. District In - Charge, School Heads and teacher - coaches shall ensure very good internet connection due to the online nature of the contest thus, venue of the





qualified participants shall be taken into consideration observing proper health protocols.

6. The spelling contest is written and shall be strictly monitored at all times by the team and spellers must follow some protocols to stay qualified in the said competition.

- Each speller will use his/her webcam to show the entire room including closed doors and spellers' ears.
- Speller's computer/laptop will be on the table with speller facing the wall
- Speller will have his/her face and hands visible in the camera during the entire time he/she is spelling.
- A speller may not leave the room at any time during the written test unless for personal necessity/emergency reason with permission from the contest team for action and consideration.
- All spellers' screens must be shared with those monitoring the test during the whole duration of the test.
- Coach/s shall stay outside the room where the contestant is, position himself/herself at the back of the participant audible when called for some reasons.

7. Participants will be provided with tag board, chalk and eraser during the contest proper by the school heads.

8. There will be 3 phases/stages of the spelling contest, the Easy, Average and Difficult phase. Easy level has 5 words to be written correctly with 1 point each, 2 points each for the 3 Average words and 3 points each for the difficult 3 words. In case of tie after the difficult round, the contestants will proceed to the clincher round to determine the winner for the place that they will be competing for.

9. The contestant are given 10 seconds to answer each word in the easy round, 20 seconds for the average and 30 seconds for the difficult round. In the event that the contestants would reach the clincher round, the contestant to write the correct spelling will get the point and will be determined winner for the place that they will be competing to.

10. Words selected for the spelling competition will be taken from Grade – 3/Grade – 4 books used by grade participants using the language specified. There will be 2 judges, 2 recorders and a Bee Master during the contest.

11. The Bee master says the word slowly and clearly once without distorting the normal pronunciation of the word. He/She uses the word in a sentence and say the word again. Then raises and say the written "go" signal on the screen. The contestants may now write the correct spelling of the given word in the tag board. After the given allotted seconds, the Bee master will raise and say "show" signal on the screen. Contestants now will show their tag board on the screen for judging until the Bee Master will give signal to put their tag boards down.





This will be repeatedly done till the final phase.

Note: A contestant who has started writing without the “go” signal or who continued to write after the given “show” signal shall not earn point/s for the written word even if it is correctly spelled but still qualify to receive point/s for the succeeding words.

12. First 3 contestants with highest points after adding the scores earned in the 3 phases are the winners and will qualify in the division level.
13. The official judges shall identify top 5 winners during the Division Spell Check Competition and the same guidelines and mechanics shall be observed.
14. The participants, school heads and coaches are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect toward others, honesty and good sportsmanship during the Spell Check contest.
15. Certificate of Participation will be given to all participants and coaches and Certificate of Recognition for all District and Division Winners.

D. Online Talent Festival

1. The competition is open to all public and private Grade 1-10 learners in the Division of Tangub City;
2. There will be an Inter school level contest in the elementary to select the best to represent in the District. In the secondary, Top Five (10) performers shall qualify for the final round.





3. In the District level, three winners shall be awarded with Certificate of Recognition. The first-place winners of the ten Districts shall proceed to the Division level final round.

4. In the Final round, Top Five 5 winners shall be proclaimed. Both the top five winning learners and advisers shall be given certificates and medals from the management.

5. The contest for the elementary category will be conducted every Thursday at 11:00 in the morning to 12:00 noon while secondary is scheduled every Wednesday at 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM.

7. The District In-charge/Principal shall endorse the name of the contestant, school and adviser to the contest coordinator thru messenger 2 days before the contest schedule;

8. The singing contest shall be done live, therefore, contestants are required to sing the song live with minus one or live accompaniment for three (3) to five (5) minutes including introduction if any;

9. For the dance contest, the school must also prepare electronic gadgets for the live performance. Music should be wholesome and lively and must not contain any subliminal, sexually suggested and vulgar lyrics /language.

10. District In-charge, school head and teacher-coaches shall ensure quality internet connection in the venue and observe proper health protocol.

D.11. Specific guidelines and mechanics for each contest shall be given by the coordinator.

Event Rules and Mechanics

- a. All officially enrolled learners with LRN are eligible to join the contest.
- b. The Event Administrators, technical committee members and judges, should be in the venue ahead of the event schedule.
- c. Event materials, supplies, tools, equipment and other things needed for the venue will be made ready before the event schedule.
- d. All contestants should be at the designated venue before the event starts. Late contestants without valid reasons shall be disqualified.
- e. The contestants must set up their tools and materials before the event starts. Setting up of their extension cords, equipment, and tools should be done during this time.
- f. Final briefing of contestants will be done fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled event.
- g. Once the event has started, the coaches, teachers, delegates are no longer allowed to talk to the participants to give them full concentration in their work.
- h. Only the videographer, photographer and contestant are allowed in the venue.
- i. Each team shall prepare a sketch plan prior to the landscape installation and submit it to the Board of Judges. The sketch plan will be signed by the judges reflecting time as well and will return the same for utilization for the contestant to start the landscaping proper
- k. The newly installed landscape shall remain unaltered and on display until the board of judges have finished individual judging.
- l. Each contestant will go through a panel interview with the Board of Judges after the four (4) hours' time allotment with a maximum of five minutes per entry.
- m. Interview shall be done one at a time using uniform questions.
- n. The working area should be cleaned by contestants immediately after the event.

2. This measures participant's oral reading accuracy of words and speed and rate in oral reading.
3. The contest shall be conducted by schools in the district to ensure 100% schools' participation and it does not limit to 1 section only. Additional number of participants to schools with more sections. Learners to compete are not identified as participants to other contests both academic and non – academic to encourage mass participation among learners, this division.
4. District In – Charge shall register names of reading challengers to the Division's Reading Challenge Team 1 day before the date contest proper.
5. The contestants are required to wear their school uniform and School ID if available. If none, any school dress comfortable is accepted.
6. District In - Charge, School Heads and teacher - coaches shall ensure very good internet connection due to the online nature of the contest thus, venue of the qualified participants shall be taken into consideration observing proper health protocols.
7. Reading Challenge is an oral reading competition and shall be strictly monitored at all times by the team and reading challengers must follow some protocols to stay qualified in the said competition.
8. Each participant will use his/her webcam to show the entire room including closed doors.
9. Reader is at all times visible in the camera during the entire reading contest.
10. Coach/s shall stay outside the room where the contestant is, position himself/herself audible when called for some reasons.
11. Participant will be provided with the reading piece when his/her turn to read orally by the reading judges.





12. Reading pieces for the contest shall be provided by the Reading Challenge coordinator, this division taken from the books and other reading materials specified for the certain grade level.

13. There will be 2 judges assigned in each district schools to rate the reading performance of all contestants and shall identify top 1 winner in the district to qualify for the division round competition.

14. Division round in the Reading Challenge shall be conducted after all district schools identify their winners following the same guidelines and mechanics.

15. The participants, District In - Charges, school heads, coaches and judges are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect toward others, honesty and good sportsmanship during the Reading Challenge competition.

16. Certificate of Participation will be given to all participants and coaches. District and division winners shall receive Certificate of Recognition and Appreciation.

- Recording the Speed and Rate in Oral Reading:





The judge records the time that the participant starts reading the passage orally; she/he computes the number of seconds/minutes that it took the participant to read the passage. Participant was asked to read the passage "The Snail with the Biggest House," a Grade 6 passage which has 103 words. It took him 1.5 minutes (90 seconds) to read the passage. Dividing 103 words by 90 seconds will yield 69; thus, learner reading rate is 69 words per minute.

Reading speed = $\frac{\text{No. of words read}}{\text{Reading time in seconds}} \times 60$

Reading time in seconds

No. of words in the passage: 103

No. of minutes it took Learner to read it: 1.5mins. (90 seconds)

$\frac{103 \text{ words read}}{90 \text{ second}} = 69 \text{ words per minute}$

Learner's reading rate: 69 words per minute
