**STRENGTHENING ON SABAYANG 4-O'CLOCK HABIT  
PARA SA DENG-GET-OUT**

To: Assistant Schools Division Superintendent

1. Relative to DepEd Memorandum No. 152, s. 2011 titled "**Preventing Dengue in Schools**" and OUA Memorandum 12-0819-0284 dated August 12, 2019, with the subject "**Search and Destroy Mosquitoes' Breeding Places Activities (Sabayang 4 o'clock Habit Para sa Deng-Get-Out) in Schools,**" this Division direct all schools to intensify public awareness and practice of the 4S strategy which stands for **Search and destroy, Seek early consultation, Self-protective measures, and Say "no" to indiscriminate fogging.**

2. Furthermore, all learners, division, and school personnel are enjoined to participate in the conduct of the **4 o'clock Habit para Deng-Get-Out activities starting on 31 May 2023, Wednesday at 4:00 pm onwards until such dengue cases are eliminated.** A massive search and destroy activities shall be simultaneously conducted to all possible breeding sites with the participation of the general public whether they are at the community, workplace, or school to make it a regular 4 o'clock habit.

3. All public elementary and secondary schools are directed to conduct massive information dissemination/campaign, posting, and distribution of information, education, and communication materials (IEC) in response to the cases. Close collaboration should be made with the Parents-Teachers Associations (PTAs), Local Government Units (LGUs), and City Health Offices (CHOs) on the following activities:

- a. conduct of information campaign against **Dengue H-Fever**;
- b. maintenance of environmental sanitation in the schools and in the communities; and
- c. referral of pupils/students/personnel with symptoms of **Dengue H-Fever.**

4. Teachers are encouraged to conduct a thermal scanning for learners before the start of the class for temperature monitoring and allocate 3-5 minutes of discussion daily for 3 weeks or more (preferably at the beginning of class) on Dengue symptoms, prevention tips and the need to seek consultation.



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5. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.
