

**INTEGRATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS IN THE CURRICULUM IN ARALING
 PANLIPUNAN AND OTHER RELEVANT CLASSES DURING THE 2023
 NATIONAL CHILDREN'S MONTH (NCM)**

1. Pursuant to Republic Act No. 10661 which declares November of every year as National Children's Month with this year's theme "Investing in our future means investing in our children," this Division, through the Curriculum Implementation Division (CID), enjoins all schools to conduct meaningful class-based activities to promote and advocate for the human rights, including the rights of children.

2. The objectives of the celebration are the following:

- a. To raise awareness among students of their rights as children and as future citizens of the nation;
- b. To incorporate the principles of children's rights in the context of Philippine history, culture, and society; and
- c. To foster an environment where students can discuss and reflect on the importance of their roles and rights in the community.

3. Teachers are encouraged to integrate topics on children's rights into their existing Araling Panlipunan lesson plans, relating these rights to historical events, cultural practices, and current events in the Philippines.

4. Activities on human rights integration are not limited to the following suggested activities at the classroom or school level:

Grade	Activities
Key Stage 1 & 2 (Grade 1 to Grade 6)	Show and Tell - Read a story or testimony that introduces elements of human rights, such as equality, kindness, or the right to education. This can be part of the <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Documentary and Film Viewing - Curate a list of documentaries and films that depict



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	activities of the 2023 Pambansang Buwan at Araw ng Pagbasa.	the evolution and challenges of children's rights for in-class viewing and subsequent discussion.
Key Stage 3 (Grade 7 to Grade 10)	Role-Playing Activities - Organize role-playing scenarios where students can act out key historical events that impacted children's rights in the Philippines.	
Key Stage 4 (Grade 11 to Grade 12)	Debates and Panel Discussions - Facilitate debates or panel discussions on historical decisions and their impact on children's rights and welfare.	b. Other human rights activities planned by the school for NCM activities.

5. Teachers must be resourceful to look for materials from any reliable sources like Learning Resource Management System (LRMDS), Google or from the teacher-made shared stories and testimonials about child protection accessible via link <https://bit.ly/38nHpvf>.

6. The school heads are required to submit narrative reports with attached pictures of the activities on or before October 30, 2023 via email at jolito.vince@deped.gov.ph.
